DENALI BOROUGH CODE

4.11.010 Personal use extraction permit.

- A. Personal use extraction permits provide for noncommercial personal use of specified quantities of resources on borough owned land per the fee schedule. A permittee may hire a commercial operator to extract and transport the gravel or sand as long as the gravel or sand is being used for personal use and not resold.
- B. The mayor or designee is responsible for decisions regarding personal use extraction permits and for setting borough-wide and/or site-specific guidelines for extraction activities.
- C. An applicant who wishes to obtain a personal use extraction permit shall file with the borough an application prescribed by the borough for a personal use extraction permit. The application and supplemental information, if necessary, is as follows for gravel and sand:
 - 1. Less than 25,000 cubic yards per year:
 - a. An application prescribed by the borough, indicating the type, location, and quantity of resource to be extracted.
 - 2. More than 25,000 cubic yards per year also requires:
 - a. A reclamation plan.
 - b. Proof of bonding, indemnification and insurance as required under DBC [4.01.080](#).
- D. An applicant who wishes to obtain a personal use extraction permit shall submit a nonrefundable fee as set in the fee schedule. A personal use extraction permit is not transferable and does not convey any interest in land. Approval must be consistent with a parcel's management plan.
- E. A personal use extraction permit is required for extracting any quantity of gravel, firewood, timber or other resource from borough land.
- F. Quantity limitations for resources other than gravel and sand will be set forth in the fee schedule.
- G. If the mayor or designee determines a personal use extraction permit may substantially affect the surrounding area, public notice and description of the proposed use shall be published per DBC [4.01.030](#). If the mayor or designee determines that substantial adverse public comment to the proposed use has been received, the mayor or designee shall hold a public hearing on the proposed use prior to making a decision regarding the permit.
- H. Failure to comply with a personal use extraction permit's terms and conditions will allow the mayor or designee to revoke the permit per DBC [4.11.006\(D\)\(2\)](#).
- I. The mayor or designee may inspect the borough land at any time to ensure compliance with the permit conditions. [Ord. 16-12 § 2.]
