ORDINANCE 17-01

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING UP TO \$215,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS FUND
TO CONSTRUCT A HEALY SOLID WASTE TRANSFER STATION

BE IT ENACTED BY THE Assembly of the Denali Borough, Alaska that:

Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is a non-code ordinance.

Section 2. Appropriation – Source and Amount. The Denali Borough Assembly appropriates up to \$215,000 from the Capital Improvements Fund. This amount is approximately one half of the Best Estimate cost to construct the transfer station.

Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to appropriate funds from the Capital Improvements Fund to design and construct a solid waste transfer station near Healy. The transfer station will provide a facility for residential disposal of municipal solid waste and household hazardous waste. It may also provide space for the processing of other wastes including recycling, yard waste, and coal ash. This allocation is expected to fully fund costs associated with planning, design and engineering, and initial site development. An additional allocation may be necessary for project completion.

Section 4. Procedure. The project will be completed in accordance with Denali Borough Code 3.35, titled "Procurement, Procedures, and Contracting Standards." Any contract over \$50,000 will not be awarded without prior Denali Borough Assembly approval.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance becomes effective upon adoption by the Denali Borough Assembly and the signature of the Mayor.
